A physical location where Agricultural Waste is Stockpiled for a Duration of more 20. than thirty (30) days and that stockpiles more than fifty (50) cubic yards of Agricultural Waste. Stockpiling. The accumulation of Agricultural Waste on an Agricultural Operation. 21. 22. Waters of the State. All accumulations of water, surface and underground, natural and artificial, public and private, or parts thereof which are wholly or partially within, which flow through or border upon the state. 23. Water Quality Limited Water Body. A water body identified by the Idaho Department of Environmental Quality, which does not meet applicable water quality standards, such as a 303d listed stream. 011. ABBREVIATIONS. There are no abbreviations in this chapter. 012. - 019.(RESERVED). SETBACKS FOR STOCKPILE SITES. Stockpile Sites at Agricultural Operations must meet the following setback requirements. 01. Stockpile Sites shall maintain the following setbacks: Three hundred (300) feet from a non-Responsible Party's Dwelling. Five hundred (500) feet from a hospital, church, school, or day care. One hundred (100) feet from a domestic or irrigation well. d. One hundred (100) feet from a non-Water Quality Limited Water Body or two hundred (200) feet from a Water Quality Limited Water Body. e. Two hundred (200) feet from any natural depression or geologic feature that could serve as a preferential pathway for surface materials and water to move into the subsurface. These structures are locally referred to as "sink holes". f. Two hundred (200) feet from any bedrock exposure at the land surface. These structures are locally referred to as "rock outcrops". 02. Stockpile Sites shall not have setbacks from a Responsible Party's Dwelling,) 03. Stockpile Staging Sites shall not be subject to the setbacks set forth in these Rules. 021. - 029.(RESERVED).
