NPC Applauds Suspension of Retaliatory Tariffs by Mexico

In a major victory for U.S. potato growers, the government of Mexico completely suspended all of the remaining retaliatory tariffs on U.S. potato exports earlier today. The move was in response to the first Mexico-based carrier being approved by the U.S. Department of Transportation for cross-border trucking, as outlined by the proposal agreed to by both the U.S. and Mexico in January.

U.S. pota to exports to Mexico had originally been subject to a 20 percent tariff in March 2009 when the tariffs were first implemented. In August 2010, those tariffs were reduced to five percent where they remained until the agreement was

signed and ultimately implemented. Since the tariffs were implemented, U.S. potato growers have seen exports to Mexico decline by more than \$70 million.

Through the collective efforts of the Alliance to Keep U.S. Jobs, NPC and industry allies aggressively pressed the U.S. government to live up to its trade obligations and find a solution to the dispute since the retaliatory tariffs were imposed. The National Potato Council was proud to serve as one of three co-chairs of the Alliance.
