As the local food movement continues to drive demand for locally grown products, consumers are increasingly more interested in meeting the producers who provide the food we eat. Thus a hot new trend, known as agri-tourism, has spread to farms across the country, allowing consumers to travel to agricultural destinations to experience farm life firsthand.

At Idaho Preferred's annual meeting on January 26, we discussed the possibility of creating a new program designed to drive agri-tourists to Idaho Preferred member locations. The program, tentatively titled "Harvest Itineraries," would encourage consumers to seek out Idaho Preferred farms and businesses to experience first-hand what's "Idaho Fresh." This would expand Idaho Preferred's current aim of informing consumers about the availability and diversity of local product s- now showing them where and how to experience it. The potential for agri-tourism in Idaho is considerable: according to a 2009 survey conducted by Colorado State University and the Colorado Department of Agriculture, 13.2 million visitors experienced Colorado agri-tourism in 2006, contributing \$2.2 billion to the state economy.

The Harvest Itinerary program will not be implemented unless Idaho Preferred has significant interest and support from Idaho Preferred participants.
