#### EPA Announces New Soil Fumigant Toolbox

EPA recently placed information on its website to assist in better understanding the soil fumigant label requirements. The link to the site is provided below and the site includes the following information.

Safety Information for Handlers of Pesticide Soil Fumigants (handler safety brochures by EPA and soil
fumigant registrants) - EPA requires that certified applicators provide safety information to handlers of soil
fumigants. These training brochures for fumigant handlers can be used by certified applicators to meet that
obligation. The EPA brochure is a vailable in English and in Spanish.

- Training Modules on New Soil Furnigant Requirements This set of nine presentations provides detailed
  information on soil furnigant uses, risks, and the required new safety measures. Available in PowerPoint, PDF,

#### NRCS extends sign-up period for Conservation Stewardship Program

#### Applications accepted through January 21, 2011

BOISE, Idaho, Jan. 5, 2011 – USDA's Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) extended the ranking period cutoff date for applications in the Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP) to January 21, 2011.

"NRCS extended the deadline for applications two more weeks to give agricultural producers more time to complete their applications," said Idaho State Conservationist Jeff Burwell. "We hope the extension will allow more producers to participate in this program."

CSP offers payments to producers who maintain a high level of conservation on their land and who agree to adopt new conservation activities. The program has a continuous sign-up with announced cut-off dates for ranking periods.

The program is open to all producers on cropland, pastureland, rangeland and non-industrial forestland, Burwell said. "Private forest landowners may not be aware of the firancial assistance this program presents," he said, "but CSP offers those landowners an opportunity to implement conservation practices that can significantly improve their forests' health."

"Organic producers can also benefit from this program. Because of the nature of organic production they may have a lready addressed resource problems on their operation; CSP can reward them for maintaining those practices and help fund additional conservation activities they plan to implement."

A CSP self-screening checklist is available to help producers determine if CSP is suitable for their operation. The checklist highlights basic information about CSP eligibility requirements, contract obligations and potential payments. From October 2009 through September 2010 Idaho NRCS funded 202 CSP applications and provided over \$4.1 million to help farmers, ranchers and private forest landowners implement conservation practices on their land.
