A practice or facility condition that does not comply with Title 22, Chapter 1, Section 22-110, Idaho Code, or the provisions of these Rules. Person. Any individual, partnership, association, firm, joint stock company, trust, political subdivision, public or private corporation, or any other legal entity which is recognized by law as the subject of rights and duties. 15. Process Waste Water. Any water containing or contacting Agricultural Waste at a Stockpile Site. 16. Responsible Party. A person who generates, receives and stockpiles Agricultural Waste on property the person owns, leases, or otherwise has permission to use as a Stockpiling Site.
